2020 Mayor's Recommended Budget Available Soon

It is with great pleasure that I can announce that the 2020 Mayor's Recommended City of Monroe Budget will be available for review beginning September 30. This document is the culmination of a significantly collaborative and inclusive process that included our Council, the Planning Commission, the Parks Advisory Board (PAB), the Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB), and City staff at all levels of the organization. with a subsequent felony charge from Lake Stevens Police Department for Attempt to Elude, resulted in a thirteen-month sentence. Found in the residence were ten puppies, five of which were rescued and provided care which led to better health and ultimately their quick adoption. The remaining five died as a result of being malnourished and improperly cared for. In recognition of her comprehensive and quality investigation, Pasado's Safe Haven awarded CSO Escalante the "Bucky Award" which is an annual award to raise awareness about crimes against animals and to recognize the officers who do exceptional work on these difficult cases.
