Getting Started:

If you are interested in serving, the city recommends you review the functions and responsibilities of the board, commission or committee, attend meetings and speak to those who have served or are currently serving. Meeting dates and times are posted on the city's website: www.monroewa.gov

How to Apply:

To apply, you must fill out an application. Applications are available on the City's website and at City Hall. As vacancies come up, the Mayor will review applicants and make appointments through a process outlined in the Monroe Municipal Code (MMC).

Civil Service Commission - Assures that police officers are recruited through open competition, are hired and promoted on the basis of merit. It oversees civil service examinations and certifies eligibility lists.

Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB) - Provides a forum for the coordination of information among entities identified as having economic development roles; recommending priorities and establishing a means to monitor progress on goals; and providing such other advice and guidance with furthering Monroe's economic development strategy.

Ethics Board - Investigates, conducts hearings, and renders advisory opinions concerning accusations against city officials of violations of ethics or conflicts of interest; also reviews and recommends periodic updates to the city's ethics Policy and its applicability.

Homelessness Policy Advisory Committee (HPAC) - Provides a forum for the coordination of information among local citizens and stakeholders to seek thoughtful, effective, and lasting solutions to the City's homelessness crisis, and to facilitate assistance for unsheltered persons in the Monroe community; the HPAC will provide the Mayor and City Council with nonbinding advice and recommendations regarding issues related to homelessness.

Lodging Tax Advisory Committee - Reviews grant applications and make recommendations to City Council regarding allocation of local lodging tax funds. Reviews and comment on any proposed imposition of lodging tax, increase in the rate of lodging tax, repeal of an exemption from lodging tax, or change in the use of revenue received from lodging tax.

Park Board - Advises the City Council on the management, supervision, improvement, and budgeting for parks and recreation facilities and programs. The Board reviews the comprehensive park and recreation plan, assists with new park sites, and advises the City Council on capital projects in city parks.

Planning Commission - Reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council concerning land use issues including zoning, code changes, and revisions to the comprehensive plan

Salary Commission - Reviews and establishes the salaries of the mayor and the councilpersons and shall exercise the powers and perform the duties set forth by RCW 35.21.015.
